In 2004, Maharashtra Institute of Technology, Pune organized an annual sports meet SUMMIT for all Engineering colleges across Pune. The event received a great response with a footfall of over 1700 students competing in a total of nine events. Since then, Summit has been progressing and thriving and has become one of the biggest National-Level Engineering Sports meet.

- In 2007, MIT Summit was declared as a State-Level Sports Meet on the occasion of MIT's Silver Jubilee.
- In 2009, MIT Summit moved on to become a National-Level Sports Meet. Over 3000 students from 60 colleges took part in the event. The commencement of the event was done by Shree. Mir Ranjan Negi, former Indian Hockey Player and MC Mary Kom, Indian Olympic Boxer and Padma Vibhushan Awardee.
- In 2012, MIT Summit was held for the 7th consecutive time, attracting over 3800 participants from major cities like Mumbai, Chennai, Nashik, etc. The main highlight of the event was the inclusion of Boxing.
- In 2015, 5200 sportspersons competed against each other in 16 different sports. V.V.S Laxman inaugurated the ceremony and enlightened everyone with his motivating words.
- In 2019, 4500 players took part in Summit from over 125 colleges. The inauguration ceremony was graced by Smt. Shital Mahajan, Indian Skydiver and holder of 6 world records along with Rutuja Bhosale, Indian Tennis Player.

Main Features of MIT-WPU Summit 2021

MIT-WPU Summit '21, the National Inter-Engineering sports meet will be hosted by MIT-WPU, Pune from **18th December to 22nd December 2021**. This would be our first event after the pandemic which comes with its bounds and regulations. Foreseeing the impact of technology on us over the pandemic, e-sports will make their debut in the 15th edition of the summit.

(Dates and venues are subjected to COVID protocols of the Government)



Prizes

The winning and runner-up teams will be given cash prizes in addition to the attractive trophies and medals worth Rs. 15 lacs. 38 Individual trophies will be awarded to the sports stars of each event. The overall championship will be awarded a grand trophy and Rs. 51,000/- cash prize.

Cricket will start on **9th December 2021** and all other events will start on **18th December 2021**.

All events will be held at MIT-WPU Kothrud Campus, MIT-ADT Loni and its vicinity.



Important Rules

- All teams should report **30 minutes** before the scheduled time at the respective venues for the fixtures. The team will be forced to forfeit their matches if they reach the respective venue **15 minutes** after their scheduled match.
- Misconduct on and off the field at any point during the event will result in disqualification from the tournament.
- Matches will be delayed if necessary due to unforeseen circumstances.
- For the Inauguration Ceremony, sports uniform & Flags of respective colleges are necessary and it is compulsory for all the participants to participate in the March Past.
- Every participant must present the **previous year's mark sheet** when demanded by the respective event head and on the registration desk.
- The teams will be required to submit **Unique ID (ERP)** of their respective college for each player in print or digital format prior to the onset of the event.
- Any participant with the **backlog** in any **final year** paper will not be allowed to participate.
- Minimum Four teams from Four different colleges are required for the conduction of an event.
- All matches will be played according to the Federation rules of respected games.
- In case of a protest, submit Rs. 3000/- as a protest fee and a protest application **before or within one hour after the match.**





Rules & Regulations



Cricket

- The maximum number of players will be 16.
- Each team will have to pay for balls, which will be provided by MIT-WPU.
- Innings will be 20 overs.
- Whites are compulsory.
- If it rains then the decision will be taken on 'bowl out'.
- In case of a tie, the winner will be decided on the wickets Fallen. If further there is a tie, then the winner is decided on a 'bowl out'.
- In case any team loses in the First Round due to 'bowl out' then 50% of their registration fees will be refunded to the respective team.



Football

- Maximum 18 players.
- In case of a draw, a penalty shootout will decide the winner.



Basketball

- Maximum 12 players are allowed to participate.
- In case of a tie, 5 minutes of extra time will be allotted.



Volleyball

- Maximum 12 players are allowed to participate.
- In the case of three sets, the third set will be of 15 points.



Baseball

- A maximum of 16 players is allowed to participate.
- Each team will have to pay for balls, which will be provided by MIT-WPU.



Badminton

- Min. players for men: 4, max: 6.
- Min. players for women: 2, max: 4.
- There will be three singles and two doubles in the men's category.
- There will be two singles and one double in the women's category.
- There can be a maximum of 3 common players in the men's category where 1 player can play only 1 double and one single.



Table Tennis

- Min. players for men: 3, max: 5.
 - Min. players for women: 3, max: 4.
- There will be 3 singles in both categories, which will be followed by 2 reverse singles if required.



Chess

- Min. players: 5, max: 6 (5 players + 1 sub)
- Chess board and chess clock is to be brought by players.
- There are no gender restrictions for the team.



Lawn Tennis

- Min. players for men: 2, max: 4.
 - Min. players for women: 2, max: 4.
- Two singles and one double match will be played.



Squash

- Min. players for men: 3, max: 5.
- Squash balls will be provided.
- All best-of-three singles match.
- All matches are played to best-of-three games.



Kabaddi

- Min. players: 10, max: 12
- Teams should ensure a uniform jersey for all players.
- Matches will be played according to Kabaddi Federation of India rules and regulations.
- Players, up to 85kg weight are allowed to participate.



Carrom

- Min. players: 3, max: 5
- There will be two singles and one double per match.
- There are no gender restrictions for the team.



Water Polo

- Min. players: 7, max: 13.
- In case of a draw, a penalty shootout will decide the winner.
- All other FINA rules will be applicable.



Swimming

- Maximum 2 players are allowed for each category from each college.
- The event will be conducted only if the number of participants is at least 4 from 3 different colleges.
- One player can participate in any three individual events.

E-Sports

Common Guidelines for E-Sports

- A team of minimum 5 and maximum 7 players can be registered for each game.
- Only students pursuing a Bachelor of Engineering (B.E.) or Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) will be allowed to participate.
- There are no gender restrictions for the team.
- All participants must have Discord installed on their devices and ensure that camera and microphone are working.
- Devices will **NOT** be provided and participants will be responsible for it.
- Participants are **NOT** required to be physically present for the event and can participate remotely.
- Only 1 team per E-Sport from each college will be allowed to register and it is advised for the participating colleges to make separate teams for each E-Sport as matches may overlap.
- Rulebook with detailed guidelines will be provided to participating teams.
- The E-Sports committee bears all the rights and can take necessary steps for investigation if required. Non-compliance may result in disqualification of the team.
- Format and dates of the events are subject to number of participants and will be conveyed prior to the event.
- All other MIT-WPU SUMMIT general rules are applicable.

Valorant

- All players must have “Competitive” mode unlocked on their accounts.
- All matches will be played on official game servers.
- All official Valorant rules are applicable
- If a player receives a game ban from Riot Games during the tournament, the entire team will be disqualified.

CS: GO

- All players in a team must have a “Prime Account”
- Any player with a VAC ban history will not be allowed to participate.
- All matches will be played on a custom server set up and administered by MIT-WPU SUMMIT E-Sports committee.
- All official CS: GO rules are applicable.
- If a player receives a VAC ban during the tournament, the entire team will be disqualified.

Common Rules

- Registration for an event from your college must be done at one time. For an event, only one team from each college can register. **Multiple entries from one college will not be accepted.**
- Once the team list is submitted at the time of registration, **no changes will be allowed.**
- The decision of the referees/umpires will be final and in any case of dispute, the captain should contact the event in charge of the organizers.
- Any changes in the schedule or timing of the match will be at the discretion of the organizers.
- We will provide First Aid Kits and Ambulance. Our university and event will not be responsible for any injuries or mishaps during the event.
- The organizing committee reserves the right to make any changes.
- Only students pursuing a Bachelor of Engineering (B.E.) or Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) will be allowed to participate.



Summit COVID-19 Guidelines:

- All team members should be fully vaccinated and have a certificate which should be uploaded during registration.
- All team members from outside Maharashtra should have a negative RT-PCR report (taken within last 72 hours) which should be submitted upon arrival in Pune.
- All team members should be medically fit and have no symptoms of cough, cold, or fever.
- Everyone must have their masks on at all times and should sanitize their hands regularly.
- All team members should always maintain social distancing.
- The team members should not have had a history of COVID-19 in the past 21 days.
- Participants won't be allowed to leave the accommodation venue without prior approval.
- If any participant feels ill, they should inform the organizing committee immediately.
- All the players and other team members will be tested for a negative Rapid Antigen Test report at the venue, if found positive further steps will be taken by the organizing committee regarding quarantine of the team.

- The teams will be required to submit **Unique ID (ERP)** of their respective college for each player in print or digital format prior to the onset of the event.
- Original Undertaking, signed by your Sports In-charge / Principal.
- Original govt. issued Photo ID for verification. (Digital/Xerox not allowed)
- The registration fee has to be paid on the website **summit.mitwpu.edu.in**
- Refer to COVID-19 guidelines for COVID related documents required during registration.

Accommodation Details

At the time of registration:

- Accommodation charges are to be paid on your arrival at MIT-WPU Campus.
- Also, you need to pay a fee of Rs. 5,000/- in cash as a deposit, which will be returned after the event. This deposit has to be paid at the time of registration itself. Accommodation will not be entertained later on.
- Extra accommodation and boarding facilities will be charged as applicable.

On your arrival in Pune:

- Report to the MIT-WPU, Kothrud Campus help desk where you will be informed about your accommodation details.
- MIT-WPU will provide you with mattresses and quilts.
- IF you have not registered beforehand then MIT-WPU will not be responsible for your accommodation.
- Registration for accommodation on the website only shows your interest and does not confirm your accommodation from our side.
- Per head expenditure for Accommodation, Food (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) & Transport will be Rs. 3,500/- for five days. On the day of inauguration i.e., 18th December 2021, only Dinner will be provided.
- The teams coming on 18th December should report at MIT-WPU Gymkhana before 2:00 pm and should be present on the ground at 3:30 pm For the march past at the Inaugural ceremony.
- Apart from this, you can make arrangements of your own at your convenience.
- The college will not be responsible for any loss.
